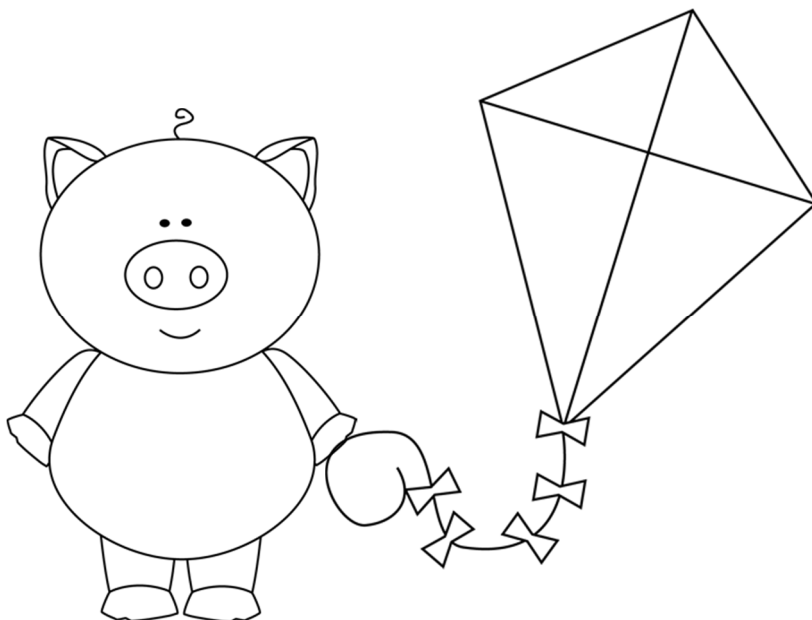
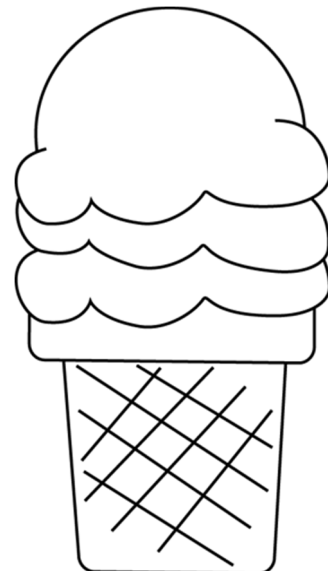
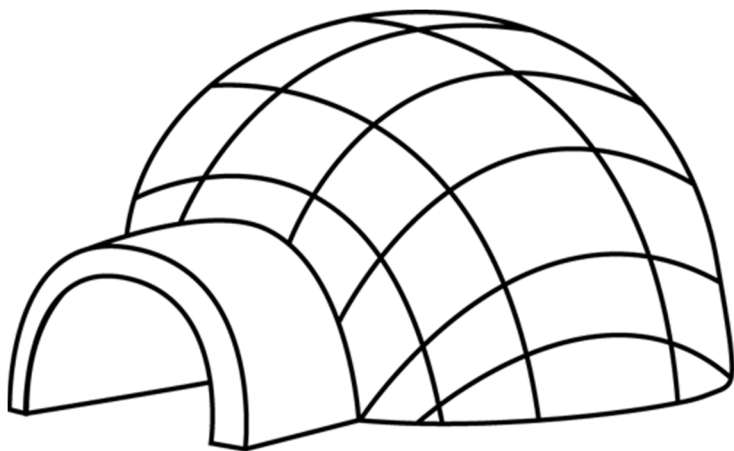
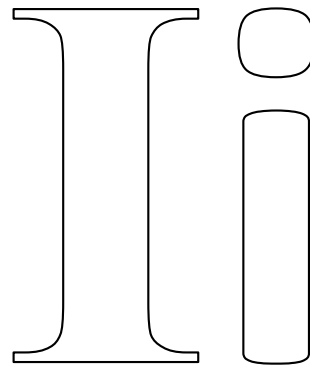


The itsy bitsy spider

Print pages 1 and 2 on separate pieces of paper.

I like to print page 1 on colored cardstock and hole-punch it on the left to insert in a 3 ring binder which serves as our alphabet lapbook. Page 1 is to be read, colored, and discussed. Point out the different sound the letter i can make (only long and short vowel words are shown, but you can introduce the less common sounds of /ee/ as in stadium or /y/ as in onion if you feel your student would benefit and not be overwhelmed from that.

Page 2 can be printed on white cardstock, cut out each shape. Use a brad to secure the partial circle on top of the whole circle so that it can spin around to reveal different pictures (inch worm, fish, bike, ice cube). Then we glue the assembled circle to the back of page 1.
